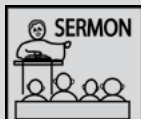

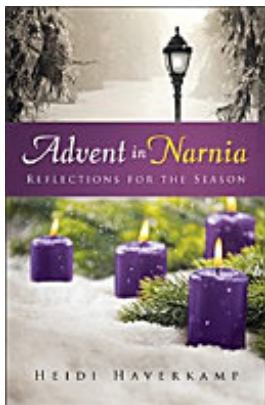
## Advent is Coming Soon!

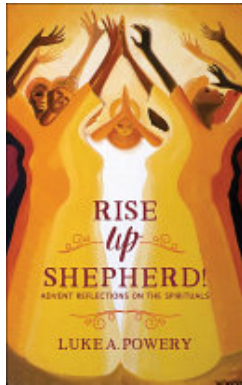
### **A Weary World: Reflections for a Blue Christmas by Kathy Escobar**

### **Advent in Narnia : reflections for the season by Heidi Haverkamp**

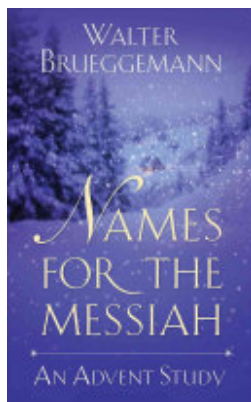

## **Rise Up Shepherd : Advent Reflections on the Spirituals by Luke Powery**

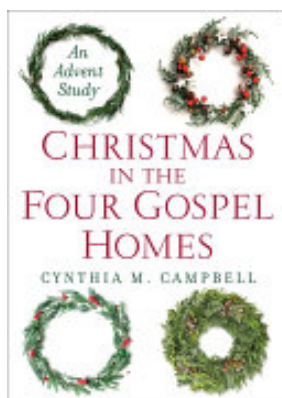
