
\* **PRAYER OF CONFESSION**

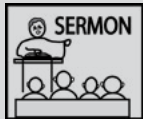


